

2. Grapheme search: Find and circle all the s letters.



4. Apply: Let's write.





Abstract

<u>Homework -</u> What can I do to support my child with homework?

- Establish good routines (this is key)
- Children are responsible for completing their homework, which will usually be a consolidation of class work, with the occasional variety or project.
- Support your child both concrete and visually if they need it
- Don't presume because they can spell for a test they can apply their knowledge / transfer this skill into their writing
- Always reward the things your child has got correct
- Homework club is every Tuesday lunchtime.
